* NEW - Where to watch birds in Peru: a new book by Tomas Valqui which aims to describe somewhere in Peru where almost any Peruvian bird species can be observed.

The book is divided in to 7 sections - The South-east; Cuzco & Southern Inter-Andean valleys; South-central Pacific slopes; Central Andes to Amazon; The North-west: Tumbes area; Maranon & Upper Huallaga; and Loreto.

The book describes 151 birding sites and explains how to reach them, where to stay, where to look for birds and what to expect.

There are 60 site maps, 7 regional maps and 3 thematic maps. The 15 biogeographic bird regions are described and illustrated. There are descriptions and pictures of the 42 most important bird habitats. More than 1200 bird species are mentioned in the text and there is a complete up-to-date Peru bird checklist.
